



Science Teacher

Hours: 4 days per week (Monday-Thursday): 3 classes per day (12 hours of class time per week); school day for teachers runs from 8:15 a.m. until 3:15 p.m.

Start Date: Tuesday, August 21, 2018

End Date: Wednesday, May 31, 2019

*Note that these dates are the dates of the school year itself. The contract begins August 1st and ends July 31st of the following year. Note training times required below.

Classes:

For the 2018-2019 school year, the science teacher will teach the following classes:

Environmental Science (2 sections)

Biology

Responsibilities of Science Teacher:

1. Plan excellent lessons according to curriculum guide and using approved texts and resources.
2. Implement lessons, teaching students science in a hands-on manner (involving labs, narration, and other creative teaching methodologies).
3. Assess students (through lab work, written work, tests, and other assessments)
4. Keep grades current using Gradelink (school provided software)
5. Meet with parents at parent-teacher conferences in October and with students and parents as needed throughout the year.
6. Attend teacher training in late July, teacher conference in October, and other in-service days as scheduled.
7. Keep all science materials organized and safe (chemicals must be stored in a chemical safe, etc.).
8. Abide by all student safety and child protection policies.
9. Attend school-wide faculty meetings once per week (Wednesday morning) and high school faculty meetings once per week (during lunch).
10. Whenever possible and as your schedule allows, attend basketball games or family events and become part of the Arborbrook community.
11. Serve on lunch and/or carpool duty once per week.

Requirements

All teachers must have:

1. A heart for God. They will be born-again, Bible-believing Christians in a growing relationship with our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.
2. A love for children. They will be kind, nurturing individuals who enjoy spending time with young people.
3. An ability to be a positive role model. They will do their best to live a life that is pleasing to God and therefore serve as a model for our young people.
4. A call on his or her life to be a teacher. They will feel that teaching is one of their spiritual gifts and feel a call on their lives to teach and impact the next generation of

Christ followers.

5. A dedication to the vision and mission of Arborbrook. They will have a thorough understanding of and be in agreement with the vision and mission of the school.
6. A teachable spirit. They must be open to training from a supervising teacher and the academic director. A positive attitude and cheerful demeanor should accompany their teachable spirit.
7. A four-year college degree.

This specific position also requires:

1. A bachelor's degree in one of the sciences
2. A strong working knowledge of the sciences
3. Excellent grammar and the ability to communicate well
4. Classroom experience

*Required Summer Training:
