Writing	<p>Narrative writing Objective: Write short paragraphs and write using adjectives. Poetry: shape poems/painted poetry, simile poems, color poems Creative writing: Write short stories from a picture, mini-explorer exploit, invent-a-planet Non-fiction writing: Friendly and business letters, “Describe that Noun,” sandwich book report</p>
Phonics & Handwriting	<p><i>Saxon Phonics Level 2</i> <i>A Reason for Handwriting Book B</i></p>
Grammar	<p><i>Easy Grammar: Daily Guided Teaching and Review for Grade 2</i> <i>Daily Oral Language</i></p>
Copy Work & Dictations	<p>Teacher led copy work & dictations from passages from literature being read in class (may also sometimes include poetry passages). Literature excerpts chosen are worthy of emulation and gradually increase length of passages during the course of the year.</p>
Spelling & Vocabulary	<p>Spelling lists from <i>Saxon Phonics 2</i> Spelling & vocabulary in context of copy work & dictations</p>
Narration Emphasis	<p>Emphasis on author’s main purpose and detailed, chronological narrations</p>
Poetry & Recitation	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Poems by poet of the year, Christina Rossetti including “Who has Seen the Wind?” “Boats Sail on the Rivers (The Rainbow),” “What is Pink?” “Growing in the Vale (Lady Daffadonwdilly)” “The Caterpillar,” and “In the Bleak Mid-Winter” (Christmas), and “To My Mother” (Mother’s Day) ● Part of the <i>U.S. Constitution</i>
